

## **DOG CELEBRATIONS**

- Two sets of puppy litters were born in our care: Lizie had a litter of 7 and Edwina had a litter of 5.
- We took in three moms along with their babies: Melanie with 5 puppies, Stella with 8 puppies, and Cherry with one puppy.
- ARR saved 15 heartworm positive dogs
- Waller's heartworm situation was so severe that he was in heart failure and needed to get heart surgery immediately. The doctors pulled out 20 heartworms and Waller made it through surgery!
- 5 dogs needed fractured limb surgeries - Jaja, Diddy, Maxwell, Zoe, and Solovino
- Bebe was diagnosed with hip dysplasia and had one hip replacement surgery with another needed this year.
- 151 dog foster homes gave loving care to our dogs waiting for their forever homes.
- 100 volunteers helped with home visits
- 45 administrative volunteers helped behind the scenes.



## **CAT CELEBRATIONS**

- ARR's neonate foster specialist took in 72 fosters, 50 of those being bottle babies, requiring round the clock care, for at least 3 weeks for each kitten. Non-bottle babies in care required intensive medical attention provided by this foster.
- 19 cats and kittens were saved from a makeshift homeless shelter in Larimer County.
- 11 kitties in our care suffered from previous injuries to their eyes, requiring eye-removal surgeries.
- ARR fosters treated dozens of cases of ringworm.
- ARR took in 560 kitties from Coalition Partners, both locally and out of state.
- In 2023, the Cat Division began partnering with the Western Slope to bring cats over to the more populated Front Range to find forever homes. Over 100 cats and kittens have been transported over and adopted.
